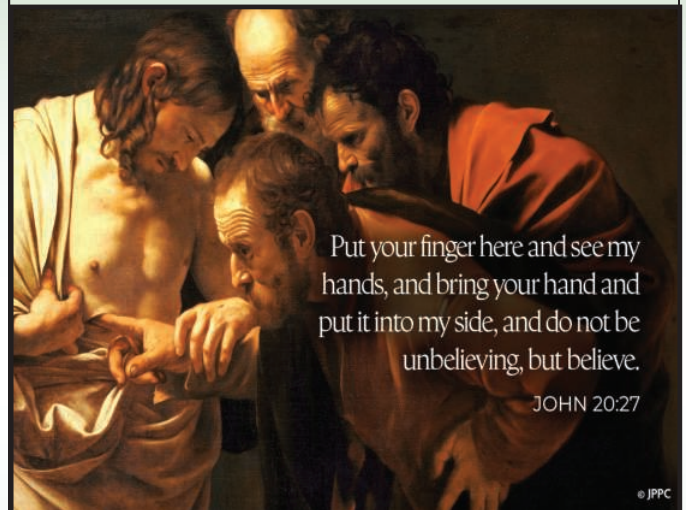

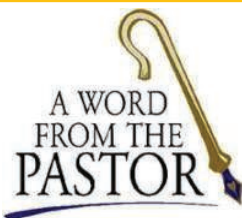

CULTURE OF LIFE CORNER

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. It provides an important opportunity to share Christ's message of mercy, especially with those who suffer because of their participation in one or more abortions. By the age of 45, as many as 1 in 3 women have had an abortion, and a similar number of men and family members have been involved. Many feel that abortion is "the unforgivable sin." They need to hear that, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives every sin of a repentant heart, even the sin of abortion. In fact, Jesus' message to St. Faustina is that the greater the sinner, the greater the right to His mercy.

DID YOU KNOW? APRIL IS ABORTION RECOVERY AWARENESS MONTH.

April is nationally known as Abortion Recovery Awareness Month. It is an opportunity to share that there is HOPE and HEALING available after an abortion experience.

An abortion experience can leave lasting emotional, physical and spiritual wounds. Women and men can struggle with feelings of sadness, regret, guilt, shame, fear, anger, anxiety and depression. They often suffer in silence. Recent studies revealed that 82 percent of women and men did not know where to go for help after their abortion experience.

AND THERE IS HELP & HEALING!

What is Project Rachel? Project Rachel (<https://hopeafterabortion.com>) is the abortion healing ministry of the Catholic Church in the United States. It is a diocesan-based network of specially trained priests, religious, therapists, and laypersons who provide a team response of care for those suffering in the aftermath of abortion. In addition to referring for Sacramental Reconciliation, the ministry provides an integrated network of services, including pastoral counseling, spiritual direction, support groups, retreats, and referrals to licensed mental health professionals so that people affected by abortion do not have to carry their burden alone.

Join St. Patrick Parish for a journey to two very special shrines, both of which are where one may obtain the Jubilee Indulgence.

Join St. Patrick Parish for a special journey to the National Shrine Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes, the oldest U.S. replica of the Lourdes shrine in France, and the National Shrine of Elizabeth Ann Seton, the awe-inspiring basilica where Mother Seton's remains are entombed. Both Shrines are places designated within the Archdiocese of Baltimore where one may obtain the Jubilee Indulgence.

We will depart St. Patrick at 8:00 AM and travel via deluxe motor coach to all destinations with an estimated return home time of 6:00 PM. Our first stop will be the National Shrine Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes and celebrate Mass at 11:00 AM. We will depart at 1:00 PM for the Shrine of Elizabeth Ann Seton. There will be time at each location for self-guided tours of the grounds. Flyer with full schedule can be found on the parish website.

Did You Know - Divine Mercy Sunday by Deacon Alan

The Second Sunday of Easter, known as Divine Mercy Sunday, invites the faithful to reflect on the boundless mercy of God poured out through the Risen Christ. Instituted by St. John Paul II in the year 2000, this feast responds to the revelations of Jesus to St. Faustina Kowalska, in which He expressed a deep desire that the whole world come to know and trust in His mercy. Divine Mercy is not a vague sentiment but the concrete love of God reaching into our sin, sorrow, and suffering to heal and restore.

When Jesus appeared to Saint Faustina in 1931, she saw Our Lord clothed in white. His left hand was touching his garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. The image of Divine Mercy symbolizes the blood and water that gushed forth from his side on the Cross, a reminder that the Church was born from his mercy and is its living vessel.

The Gospel proclaimed on this day (John 20:19-31) presents the risen Jesus appearing to his disciples, breathing the Holy Spirit on them, and giving them the authority to forgive sins. Mercy is not only to be received, but is also to be shared. In a world tempted by vengeance, bitterness, and indifference, Divine Mercy calls us to become instruments of God's love.

Jesus told St. Faustina, "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to my mercy." Divine Mercy Sunday is a call to trust Jesus, to seek the sacrament of reconciliation, and to become living witnesses of the mercy we have received.

PARISH REGISTRATION:

Registration is held on the First Sunday of Each Month or at the parish office. Roman Catholics who live within the boundaries of the parish should register in the parish. This will regularize one's status and allow for the issuance of certificates and make possible the arrangements for Baptism, Weddings and Confirmations.

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
