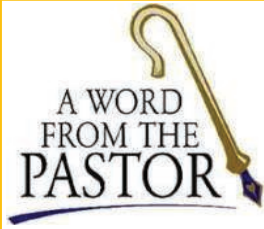

My Dear Parishioners,

Praise be Jesus Christ! Happy New Year! Happy Advent! Of course, this is the great beginning of the Church’s Liturgical Year. With that said, a lot proceeds Advent, generations of Salvation History, centuries of God calling, leading and guiding His People. But in Advent, God becomes one with His People. We celebrate the Advent, the coming, of Jesus Christ, the Eternal Son of God the Father, in human flesh. Christians are the only faith on earth that celebrate this and as Christians, we have another opportunity to celebrate it well. What might that mean for us? Allow me a few ideas for consideration:

**1) Plan now to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Advent.** Many of our young people will be celebrating the Sacrament this Saturday for the First Time! How beautiful this Gift of God is to us every time, particularly for those times when we find ourselves in MORTAL SIN, in need of God’s tender Mercy. How beautiful that such Mercy is available!

**2) Make room this Advent for Silence.** Perhaps in the car – do away with the radio. Or at night, don’t turn on the TV. Make room for Silence.

3) Some are able **to come to daily Mass.** Did you know that our daily Mass is under 30 minutes long? Monday, Tuesday, Thurs and Friday, Mass is at 7:30AM. Wednesdays 7PM. Saturday 8AM. Many who attend daily Mass report a great start and foundation to the day.

**4) Make a Monday Appointment for Adoration.** Adoration is quiet time before the Risen Lord present in the Monstrance. Whether it’s 15 minutes or an hour, making a visit to Church can be making a visit to the supermarket. Only the benefits are far more lasting.

**5) Commit to a particular act of kindness/charity.** The hunger for charity runs deep and sometimes it’s so terribly hidden. Be intentional this Advent not just in your generosity but in your kindness/charity in thought, word and deeds to others.

Finally, as I type this column, I’m struck by the Gospel of this particular day and share it with you here with a questions and challenge. Namely, will we recognize the time of our Visitation? I pray we do!

**Did You Know?**

The Immaculate Conception: Its True Meaning  
by Stephen P Conlon

If you were to randomly ask people about the meaning of the Immaculate Conception, most non-Catholics (and many Catholics) mistakenly say that it refers to the virgin birth of Jesus. The “immaculate” part, so this reasoning goes, is that Jesus was conceived without the benefit of a human father. Jesus’ conception in the womb of Mary was certainly miraculous. At the Annunciation we learn from the Archangel Gabriel that Mary was “overshadowed” by the Holy Spirit. The confusion over the Immaculate Conception, although understandable, is profound and tends to take away our full understanding of Mary in the economy of salvation.

The Immaculate Conception is the title given to Our Blessed Mother in reference to how she herself was conceived. Her conception was not virginal. Mary, unlike Jesus, had both a human father and a human mother. The uniqueness of Mary’s conception is that although she was conceived in the natural way, she was, unlike all other human creatures, conceived without original sin. Jesus’ virginal conception announced by Gabriel at the Annunciation is recognized by the Church as the Incarnation—when the Word became flesh.

The belief in Mary’s sinlessness at her conception started in the early Church. Over time it grew in popularity and eventually gained such momentum among the faithful that on December 8, 1854 it was formally and infallibly recognized by Pope Pius IX as dogma in the Apostolic Constitution (*Ineffabilis Deus*). After reading *Ineffabilis Deus*, you wonder why the dogmatic proclamation didn’t come sooner.

Some ninety years later, in 1943, Pope Pius XII released a papal encyclical called *Mystici Corporis Christi*. In that document, the Holy Father explained that Mary was free not just at conception from original sin, but “free from all sin, original or personal.” The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated on December 8th and is a Holy Day of Obligation.

It is a wonderful fact that Our Lady herself confirmed her title as the Immaculate Conception just three years after Pope Pius IX first issued *Ineffabilis Deus*. On March 25, 1858, she appeared to Bernadette Soubirous, in Lourdes, France and identified herself as the Immaculate Conception. God be praised!

Red is for the feast of the Holy Spirit. This feast is celebrated 50 days after Easter known as Pentecost or the “Church’s Birthday.”
