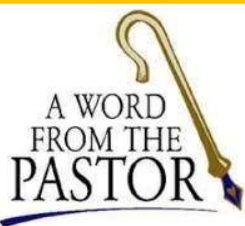

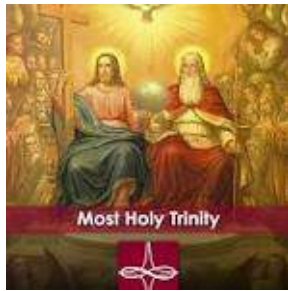

Did You Know: The Nicene and Apostle's Creeds**By Joe Hines, Pastoral Council**

We are all well aware of the Nicene and Apostle's Creeds. The Nicene Creed is prayed at Sunday mass and the Apostle's Creed is the first prayer of the rosary and one of the prayers of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. But why do we have two creeds and how do they differ?

The Apostle's Creed is thought to date back to sometime in the 2nd century and summarizes the beliefs of the Apostles. It comes from what really happened and what happened in the lives of the Apostles. It tells the Gospel story and states our faith in the God who accomplished these great things and our belief that they were really accomplished. Although it defines our core beliefs, it does not clearly define the nature of Jesus Christ's divinity, thus leaving room for heresies to enter (particularly Arianism which questioned Jesus' divinity).

The first Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. was convened to address these heresies. The council affirmed the belief in one God, the Trinity, and the Church. A product of the Council was the Nicene Creed. It was further refined at the Council of Constantinople in 381 A.D. and more clearly states the divinity of Jesus Christ (only begotten Son of God) and the Holy Spirit (who proceeds from the Father and the Son). It more directly states that all that God did was for us and our salvation.

Although the Nicene Creed is more expansive, there are two assertions in the Apostle's Creed that have no mention in the Nicene Creed. The first is: "He descended into hell." This relates to the first letter of Peter in which he states that, after His death, Jesus "went and preached to the spirits in prison", those waiting for the gates of heaven to be opened. The other assertion is that of a "communion of saints" which can be related back to Paul's letter to the Romans that states: "we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another."

To understand these Creeds is to understand what we believe as Catholics.
