

My Dear Parishioners,

Praised be Jesus Christ! For the first time since February 11, we find bishops, priests and deacons wearing Green today as we are now back into Ordinary Time. Given all that we have seen unfold over these 4 months and all that continues to unfold in our world, it would be correct to note that there's nothing ordinary about our times! As one priest friend likes to tell me, "Chris, you can't make this stuff up!". So many Extraordinary --- strange things!

Take for instance news out of Lincoln, Nebraska this week entitled "**Bizarre**". A 74 year old woman declared dead by her hospice team, taken to the funeral home was found breathing! Amazing, yes! Bizarre? I'm not sure that that's the right word.

How might the news report the event that I witnessed in Lincoln, Nebraska the week prior. Five ordinary young men –sons and brothers -- from a variety of different cultures ordained Priests of Jesus Christ. Now able in Jesus' name to turn bread into flesh, absolve sins, cast out Satan! Amazing, yes! Bizarre? No.

And yet, when you take the Gospel at face value, when you look at what we believe and yes...we do believe that dead bodies will arise, that priests can turn bread into flesh, absolve sin and cast out Satan, that the lay faithful are Christ's Body....when you look at all of this, the world's response is "**Bizarre**". And we might even find that response arising from our own selves!

In Calendar year 2023, our parish identified 3 priorities to assist our community's growth in discipleship: 1) Build confidence in the teachings of the Catholic Faith through Education. 2) Build Parish Engagement through Community. 3) Foster Spiritual Growth through Joyful Witness. We've taken steps in all three this past year. But the 1st priority, "Build Confidence in the Teachings of the Catholic Faith". That's not just education, it's allowing the heart to be enkindled by what we believe.

To the world, the teachings of the Church may seem "**bizarre**". But that's ignorance at best, blasphemy at worst. And many fall prone to both. We must not fall for either. Rather, accepting the Truth in mind and heart, we allow it to make us brave, to work miracles and we need that Work today.

CULTURE OF LIFE CORNER

A Spiritual Bouquet to St. Joseph, Patron of Fathers

Fatherhood has its origins in God, who chose to reveal Himself to us as Our Father, sending his only Son for the sake of our salvation. Fathers therefore have a special role, “in revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God” (*Familiaris consortio* 25)

All men are called to the vocation of spiritual fatherhood; some are also called to live this out as fathers of biological, adopted, or foster children. While not a liturgical observance, Father’s Day provides a wonderful opportunity to recall the essential role of fathers in the life of the family and in building a culture of life. It is also an opportunity to highlight the spiritual fatherhood of godparents, priests, deacons, uncles, and other men who often serve as fathers in important ways within extended family, parish communities, or individuals’ lives. Indeed, the role of father “is of unique and irreplaceable importance” (FC 25). As such, Father’s Day affords us the perfect moment to pray for all fathers including those facing an unexpected pregnancy, those struggling with infertility, those who have lost children, and those who have lost their own fathers.

St. Joseph, himself, was unexpectedly called to both practical and spiritual fatherhood, and amid very difficult circumstances. But despite all obstacles, Joseph was faithful. He welcomed life of the Christ Child, offering care and protection to Mary and Jesus. As a Church community, we need to encourage and support men to follow the example of St. Joseph and embrace their various roles as father.

A Spiritual Bouquet is individual prayers and acts of devotion offered up on someone’s behalf. This Father’s Day we invite you to lift up the many intentions laid on your heart to the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of Fathers, while also honoring him, and giving him thanks for his fatherly love and care. Each individual act is like a spiritual flower that when gathered with other acts and prayers becomes a “bouquet.”

When you come to Church next weekend, you will find intention cards in the pews. After all Masses, the Respect Life Ministry invites you to spend some time with St. Joseph - write down your prayer intentions and then place them in the basket that will be in front of the St. Joseph statue. We hope this spiritual bouquet provides an opportunity to pray for the intentions brought to your heart by Father’s Day. This offering will remain throughout the month of June serving as a visual remembrance of the important vocation of fatherhood and the gift of life. Let us all cherish the gift of life we receive from our fathers and entrust all men to whom God gives life to the protection and care of St. Joseph.

Pilgrimage to Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe




