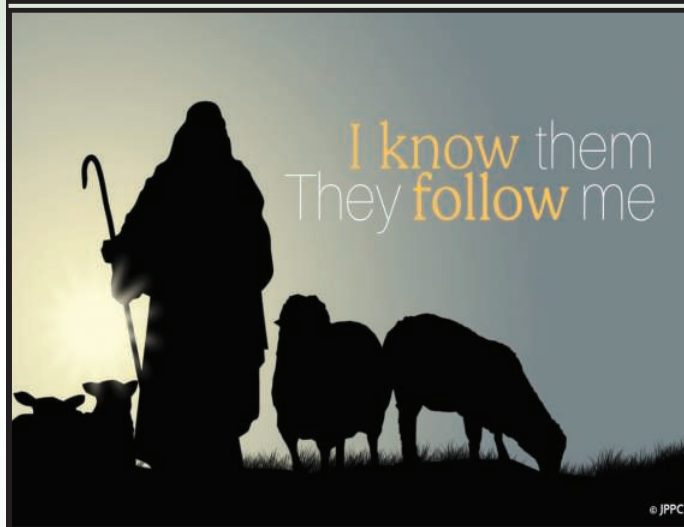

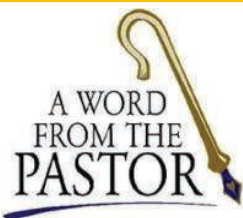

My Dear Parishioners,

Praised Be Jesus Christ and a Very Happy Mothers' Day to all our dear moms! This week marks 64 years since Pope St. John XXIII issued his encyclical letter entitled *"Mater et Magistra"* (i.e. Mother and Teacher). He used those words to describe both the Identity and Mission of the Catholic Church. The opening paragraph of that letter reads:

Mother and Teacher of all nations—such is the Catholic Church in the mind of her Founder, Jesus Christ; to hold the world in an embrace of love, that men, in every age, should find in her their own completeness in a higher order of living, and their ultimate salvation. She is "the pillar and ground of the truth." To her was entrusted by her holy Founder the twofold task of giving life to her children and of teaching them and guiding them—both as individuals and as nations—with maternal care. Great is their dignity, a dignity which she has always guarded most zealously and held in the highest esteem.

I share these words of our Pope Saint this weekend not only because it's Mothers' Day. But because in this time when so many in the world are looking toward the Catholic Church, it's worth recalling the Church's Identity and Mission. For some, the Church is a cause of scandal and hurt; for others, She is a beauty and mystery. She is perfect in her Founder and imperfect in us! All at the same time! Even the saints recognized this paradox. From St. Paul to 20th Century theologian, Romano Guardini who famously wrote that "the Church is the cross on which Christ was crucified"! There is a deep mystery to the reality that is the Church, the Body of Christ!

Mark Shea writes that *"The only person in the world who feels a greater exasperation with the Church than the one who hates her is the one who loves her"*! We can understand this in through the lens and vocation of a Mother. How great is a mother's love and how often we have caused great exasperation to our moms! (Not just in our birth but way beyond!) Indeed, moms like no one else suffer for their children, and they do so with great tenderness and love. As such, they deserve our love. So too does the Church.

As we celebrate this Mother's Day weekend, as sons and daughters of the Church, let us cultivate a special love for our moms and our Mother, the Church. May our Blessed Mother, Mary of Nazareth, Mother of the Church pray for us, nourish us and teach us the Way of Her Son!

Mulch Donation

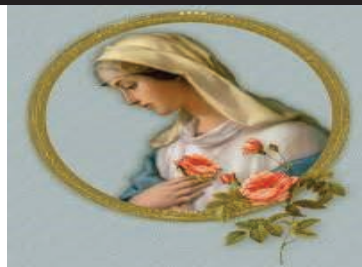

Did You Know: The Divine Mercy Chaplet

In 1935 Faustina Kowalska received a vision instructing her to promote God's mercy and teach the chaplet. The chaplet is a prayer meant to invoke God's mercy. After her death in 1938, the chaplet gained recognition, especially after Pope John Paul II canonized Saint Faustina in 2000. The Pope established the feast of Divine Mercy to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Pope John Paul II said:

"There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy – that love which is benevolent, which is compassionate, which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God."

We pray the chaplet to invoke God's mercy on us and the whole world and for personal, global, and spiritual healing. The chaplet is designed to be said over a nine day cycle which coincides with the time between Good Friday and Divine Mercy Sunday. There are different prayers for each of the nine days focused on: sinners, priests and religious, the devout and faithful, those who do not believe in God, those who have separated themselves from the Church, the meek and humble and little children, those who venerate God's mercy, those in Purgatory, and those who have become lukewarm.

In addition to these specific daily prayers, there are opening and closing prayers as part of saying the chaplet, but the central part of the chaplet follows the beads of the rosary. For each decade, it starts (on the Our Father bead) with the prayer:

"Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

Then on the Hail Mary beads, the prayer is: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." These are said for each of the five decades. There are small chaplet booklets on the table by the stairs to the choir loft. Our group at St. Patrick's that prays the rosary after weekday morning masses also prays the chaplet as a perpetual novena cycling through each of the nine days. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is a powerful expression of trust in God's mercy, offering grace and healing.
