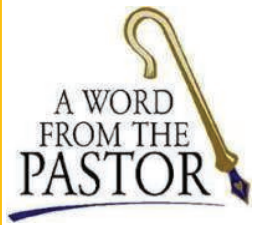

My Dear Parishioners,

Praised be Jesus Christ! As the beautiful Season of Easter continues, we come today to the end of the Novendiales – the 9 Days of Mourning and Prayer for our Deceased Holy Father. The Conclave will begin on Wednesday and our prayer will turn toward the Cardinals who will gather to elect a new Pope. How does that work proceed? In short,

The cardinal electors process to the Sistine Chapel and take an oath of absolute secrecy before sealing the doors. The cardinals vote by secret ballot, processing one by one up to Michelangelo's fresco of the Last Judgment, saying a prayer and dropping the twice-folded ballot in a large chalice. Four rounds of balloting are taken every day until a candidate receives two-thirds of the vote. The result of each ballot are counted aloud and recorded by three cardinals designated as recorders. If no one receives the necessary two-thirds of the vote, the ballots are burned in a stove near the chapel with a mixture of chemicals to produce black smoke.

When a cardinal receives the necessary two-thirds vote, the dean of the College of Cardinals asks him if he accepts his election. If he accepts, he chooses a papal name and is dressed in papal vestments before processing out to the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica. The ballots of the final round are burned with chemicals producing white smoke to signal to the world the election of a new pope.

The senior cardinal deacon announces from the balcony of St. Peter's "Habemus Papam" ("We have a pope") before the new pope processes out and imparts his blessing on the city of Rome and the entire world.

While we know that the Holy Spirit is involved in this process, a good question to ponder is if the Holy Spirit is responsible for the election of the Pope? In 1997, Cardinal Ratzinger answered this very question. And I share it here with you:

I would not say that the Holy Spirit picks out the pope. . . I would say that the Spirit does not exactly take control of the affair, but rather like a good educator, as it were, leaves us much space, much freedom, without entirely abandoning us. Thus the Spirit's role should be understood in a much more elastic sense, not that he dictates the candidate for whom one must vote. Probably the only assurance he offers is that the thing cannot be totally ruined...There are too many contrary instances of popes the Holy Spirit obviously would not have picked!

In other words, we pray for the Cardinals and take great solace in Jesus words to Peter.

"And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it! (Mt. 16, 18)

During the presentation of Baptism, the children hear it proclaimed that through our Baptism, we receive the gift of the light and life of Christ who died and is risen; the paschal candle is the sign of His risen life and light; the baptismal candle and the white garment are signs of this gift to us. In the second part of this presentation the children are introduced to water. They are reminded that water cleanses us from Original Sin. The children are given the opportunity to practice what would have occurred at their Baptism. By using a shell, they pour water over their fist and say, "You are Baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Do you wonder why they use their fist and not a doll? The fist is used because it is part of them, they reflect on what may have occurred on their Baptism Day.
