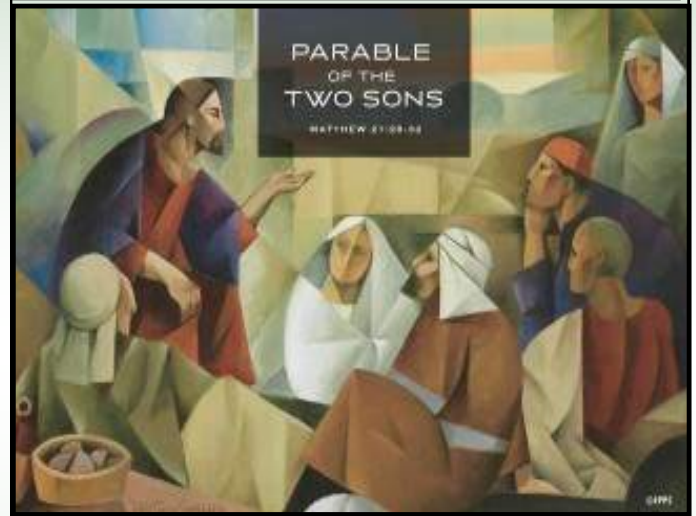

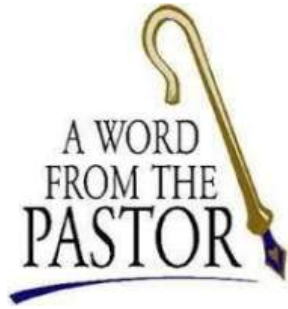

My Dear Parishioners,

Greetings and Praised be Jesus Christ! As October begins, so too does Post-Season Baseball and once again this year, I hope to RING THE BELL late into October, with every Phillies win! GO PHILLIES!

This month, this week actually, all the priests of the Archdiocese will gather for our Annual Fall Meeting. This year, Archbishop Perez has asked each priest to read and be ready to discuss a book entitled: **From Christendom to Apostolic Mission: Pastoral Strategies for an Apostolic Age**. It's a short little book that it rings a loud and sobering bell. It proposes that we are not simply living in an age of change but we are living in a change of ages; From an age of Christendom, when institutions, culture, civilization were based on Christian terms; To a time similar to that of the Apostles, when paganism ruled.


Some great Saints and Popes have termed this time an Age of Mercy: A time that declares not "I'm ok, you're ok and that's ok" or "Love is Love". But rather, a time that declares and delivers the very Truth of Our Faith. Namely, that you and I are not OK. BUT God has loved us and sent His Son into this world. That that Son loved us unto death; and His death conquered death forever. This is the great work of God, the heart of Christian Faith and it is our great Gift and Mission: To Live the Life & Love of Christ!

Over the ages, depending on the times, Living the Life & Love of Christ has appeared different. At times, it has entailed trial and martyrdom; at other times, it enjoyed blessing and building. What about these our times? What does living the Life & Love of Christ look like/demand? It's a good question and worthy of thought. But whatever it may demand --suffering, courage, generosity -- the Mission of the Gospel must constantly convict, convert and compel us more and more to be more and more Christ Jesus.

A final thought for your thought this week which I think relates to this. British writer Paul Kingsworth says that ***"All day everyday we use narratives to make sense of the ongoing confusion of reality and of the business of being human."*** What is the narrative that you are using to make sense of the confusion that you face each day? Is it the Christian Narrative found above – the narrative of Christian Faith? Or is it something else? We must realize that we are not spectators in the work of God; we are active participants in His saving work. And that work continues, the story of Christian History is being written. Realize your place in the great "Theo-Drama" and allow Christianity to be the narrative, the Good News, the Compass that directs your life. The BELL that rings in your heart.

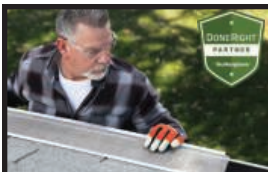
PARISH REGISTRATION
