THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD



My Dear Parishioners,

Greetings and Praised be Jesus Christ! As you can see from the colors at Mass this weekend (white vestments instead of green), today marks a significant day. August 6 is Transfiguration Day, the day we celebrate the Transfiguration of Jesus. We remember that moment when Apostles Peter, James and John saw Jesus' Glory, heard the Father's Voice and were enrapt in a cloud of glory. That event was significant and the date we celebrate it, 40 days before the Triumph of the Cross (September 14th) is a reminder of the Exodus that God made and has willed for all of us to make: from this world to the next.

In Modern Times, the dates of August 6 and 40 Days thereafter stand out for other reasons. It was on August 6, 1945, that the First Atomic Bomb was dropped on a city full of people. A day when humanity witnessed not a cloud of glory, but a cloud of death which still lingers and threatens human life. Fast forward 40 days and + years to September 14, 2001 and most of us remember when our cities of Washington DC, New York and Shanksville were hit. Reminders of our fallen condition and why the Transfiguration and Jesus' Exodus remain such Good, necessary news.

Now, let me throw in another date for your consideration, August 15, the Solemnity of The Blessed Mother's Assumption. Her exodus day! Not an exodus out of the body, away from us. Rather, an Exodus Body and Soul into Glory. This day has been celebrated since the 5th century and is pointed to in the Scripture. She is the Woman clothed in the Sun; The Woman whose Son is Savior; The Woman who was given to us as Mother by her Son. We have before us a Novena of Days. And in light of all that is going on in the world today. I encourage you to turn toward her in prayer. Pray for our world, for God's Will, for the advancement of God's Kingdom Glory and Reign. Pray that where She has gone, we may follow.
