Praised be Jesus Christ! On this weekend between Christmas and New Year's, the Church celebrates <u>Holy Family Sunday</u>! What a Family that is! On the one hand, it may seem very different from our family. It was so very small (just three!) and what's more, it was just about perfect. (St. Joseph was the imperfect one!). Yet, that Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is so very BIG and THE Model of perfection for all families. For in them, amidst the particular challenges of their day, we find such great love, learning, trust and respect – for God, Self and One Another. We find the meaning of Family.

But I do know what Christmas has brought into this world: **JESUS**. And He came through a family. He came as a baby to be loved, so as to grow, so as to mature, so as to teach, lead, guide and save. And all of that happened because His Family Loved.

Whatever is happening in our family, there is the opportunity to LOVE. And if that were to happen, if our families were to become arenas in which we were willing to learn Love, great things will happen!

May God grant us that wonderful grace!
