

My Dear Parishioners,

Praised Be Jesus Christ! As we begin the month of June, continue in these last days of the Easter Season and as my time as Pastor here comes to a close, I'd like to share in the next 3 weeks some closing thoughts. For this week, **Love is not just taught, it's caught.** Or as this story tells it, it's shown. Consider the following from a Facebook Page entitled "Interesting World":

"Put the little chain on me too, Dad..."

"Put the chain on me," the boy whispered, eyes filled with quiet hope. That morning was like so many others: — "Get up! Wash your face! Comb your hair! Put your shirt on — hurry!" — "No time for breakfast! Take your juice with you — and don't spill it!" — "What did I just say, huh? You already stained it! I'm sick of this. You never do anything right!" The boy said nothing. He couldn't say "Dad." He was afraid.

At school, he couldn't focus. Always lost in thought. Always sad. He kept wondering why other kids were happy... and he wasn't.

Later that day, in a rare moment of courage, he spoke: — "Today my teacher asked, 'What does your dad do for work?' And I didn't know what to say..." — "I train dogs," his father replied, still not looking up.— "What do you teach them?" the boy asked softly. — "To be obedient. Not to destroy things. To protect. To guide the blind. To save lives. To be patient, brave, and loyal. And to do it all... without expecting anything in return." — "And how do you train them?" — "I just put a little chain on them. The father broke down in tears. And in that embrace, a new kind of chain was formed —An invisible one, made of love, patience, and tenderness. One that, if cherished, never breaks. Let's not forget: our children need time, care, and gentleness. Because love isn't shouted... it's shown.

My friends, God does not deal with us with chains, He deals with us in His Son – who is our Hope and the Way to the Father. Even in our rebellion, every human being longs for God. How beautiful that the above father and son, realized "a new kind of chain connecting them" – a chain of Love. How beautiful that we can realize the same in our relationship with God and His relationship with us.

I thank God for helping me to realize this more deeply in my years here as Pastor. You have taught me more of what it means to be a Father. And I am grateful. As we await Pentecost, let us open our hearts to the Holy Spirit who is the Love of the Father and the Son. And let us rejoice that we are forever One in Him!
