
### TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



#### My Dear Parishioners,

Praised be Jesus Christ! For the first time since February 11, we find bishops, priests and deacons wearing Green today as we are now back into Ordinary Time. Given all that we have seen unfold over these 4 months and all that continues to unfold in our world, it would be correct to note that there's nothing ordinary about our times! As one priest friend likes to tell me, "Chris, you can't make this stuff up!". So many Extraordinary --- strange things!

Take for instance news out of Lincoln, Nebraska this week entitled "*Bizarre*". A 74 year old woman declared dead by her hospice team, taken to the funeral home was found breathing! Amazing, yes! Bizarre? I'm not sure that that's the right word.

How might the news report the event that I witnessed in Lincoln, Nebraska the week prior. Five ordinary young men —sons and brothers -from a variety of different cultures ordained Priests of Jesus Christ. Now able in Jesus' name to turn bread into flesh, absolve sins, cast our Satan! Amazing, yes! Bizarre? No.

And yet, when you take the Gospel at face value, when you look at what we believe and yes...we do believe that dead bodies will arise, that priests can turn bread into flesh, absolve sin and cast out Satan, that the lay faithful are Christ's Body....when you look at all of this, the world's response is **"Bizarre"**. And we might even find that response arising from our own selves!

In Calendar year 2023, our parish identified 3 priorities to assist our community's growth in discipleship: 1) Build confidence in the teachings of the Catholic Faith through Education. 2) Build Parish Engagement through Community. 3) Foster Spiritual Growth through Joyful Witness. We've taken steps in all three this past year. But the 1st priority, "Build Confidence in the Teachings of the Catholic Faith".
