Praised be Jesus Christ and a Happy Mother's Day Weekend to all our dear moms, grandmoms, sisters and wives as we celebrate this magnificent day.

Recently, our crumbling culture has been asking "What is a Woman?". A better question is "Who is a woman?". For "woman" is always a who. She is God's irreplaceable masterpiece – the one whose tender love we all need, and without which we simply would not be. Cardinal Mindszenty put it this way:

The Most Important Person on earth is a mother. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral -a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body. . . The angels have not been blessed with such a grace. They cannot share in God's creative miracle to bring new saints to Heaven. Only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creature; God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation. ... What on God's good earth is more glorious than this: to be a mother?"

Whether we realize it or not, the Catholic Church is a Mother. This week marks the 63rd Anniversary of Pope John XXIII Enclyclical: <u>Mater et</u> <u>Magistra</u> -- A letter about the Church who is Mother and Teacher. Always portrayed as feminine, the Church is the Bride of Christ who Receives, Sustains, Forms and Nourishes Life. In addition, in her very nature, She is also a teacher and we are the privileged disciples. In advance of Pentecost next week, I strongly encourage you to reflect on the Church as Mother and Teacher.
