
PENTECOST SUNDAY MAY 19, 2024



My Dear Parishioners,

Praised be Jesus Christ and Happy Pentecost! This 50<sup>th</sup> Day of the Easter Season is sometimes referred to as the Birthday of the Church. The Day on which the Holy Spirit fell on the Apostles and the Blessed Mother in a New Way and sent them forth into the world. This "sending forth" is so very important and is built into the nature of our very substance. An ocean without an ebb and flow becomes sick; A heart without a receiving and giving is a dead heart; and a Church that never goes forth is selfish. So Pentecost is a critical moment, a happy moment in the Life of the Church ... a great COMING FORTH/SENDING.

Now that our new Narthex is complete, a number of people have been asking me, "Father, what's the next project!" I look at them and smile. I LOVE the life and energy of this parish and the desire for more. So, as announced 2 weeks ago, here's the next immediate project: SHARING CATHOLIC JOY!
